
How you can get involved!


Arup, on behalf of SEStran, are currently undertaking an extensive stakeholder engagement exercise, having already undertaken desktop research and site audits.

Engagement is a very important part of the project in terms of understanding the local context, the key issues and learning from local knowledge that can be encompassed into the proposals at an early stage.

As part of the stakeholder engagement stage, we have launched this 'Virtual Engagement Room' for feedback on the Kinghorn to Kirkcaldy and Cupar to Guardbridge studies. This provides you with an opportunity to have your say and influence the emerging proposals, please use the feedback button to do so!

In conjunction with this virtual engagement room, there will be in-person community workshops held for Kinghorn to Kirkcaldy on Tuesday 9th January 2024, and Cupar to Guardbridge on Tuesday 5th December 2023. Details of these sessions will be issued separately. The proposals for each route will be informed by the outcomes of the engagement exercise, as well as any comments and feedback received through the virtual engagement room.

- 1. Do you a feel high-quality walking, cycling and wheeling routes from Kinghorn to Kirkcaldy, and Cupar to Guardbridge, will be beneficial to each local area?
- 2. What are the key facilities and services within each area?
- 3. What are the current barriers for walking, wheeling or cycling on each of the routes?
- 4. What types of improvements would you like to see and where?

The outcomes of this virtual engagement room and future workshops will influence the concept proposals being developed for the Kinghorn to Kirkcaldy and Cupar to Guardbridge routes. The outcomes will be shared in summary through future project stages.
